	transportation or childcare making it difficult for students to begin or continue training. Some families are not supportive of the studying that is needed to be successful.	
	b. Lack Self-Advocacy Skills: Some students do not know how to negotiate with organizations for services or advocate for their needs so they are never known.	
	c. Lack of SSN for refugees and asylees and some don't have work permits. If they have refugee or asylee status, they are legally in the country; however, they have to continue waiting for their documents before being able to work.	
	d. Partners also noted that students, consumers, and participants remain concerned over contracting coronavirus.	
	Partners discussed "needs" to be addressed: a. Many are asking for jobs that allow remote work.	
	The partners discussed goals to focus on over the next program year:
